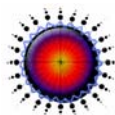

INVITATION TO JOIN THE HCS INTERNSHIP PROGRAM IS BY INVITATION ONLY

CRITERIA AND GUIDELINES FOR SELECTION:

- Selection of students in high school (grades 9-12) and in some – exceptional cases – grades 7-9 students.
- Students should perform well in their school and recommended by their science teachers and principal.
- They should have a drive to succeed AND to move ahead and an innate desire to help others.
- Interviews are conducted by Dr. Sat Bhattacharya from March through till June.
- Students should contact their Science Teachers, Guidance Counselors and Principals.
- All students receive a handsome stipend for their work.

Please note that students WILL BE CHOSEN using the following guidelines:

- * Preference is given to students whose total annual family income does not exceed the Harlem Children Society guidelines shown under FINANCIAL GUIDELINES
- * The family income maximum is \$35,800 FOR A FAMILY OF FOUR; however, the Committee will support applications from students whose family income is up to \$50,000, if evidence is provided that factors, which contribute to under-representation in the sciences, are present.
