



2004 PROGRAM

FORTY-EIGHT (48) High school students (Grades 9, 10, 11, & 12) from 17 schools from inner city neighborhoods were interviewed and selected for the program. The students were selected based on their motivation, enthusiasm and performance at school, on the recommendations from their principal and science teachers, and the interview during the selection process.

The students are inducted as interns at prestigious Universities and institutions such as <u>Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center</u>, <u>Rutgers</u>, <u>Columbia University</u>, <u>Hunter College</u>, <u>New York Univ.</u>, <u>Beth Israel Medical Center</u>, <u>Fordham University</u>, <u>American Museum of Natural</u> <u>History</u>, <u>Stevens Institute of Technology</u>, <u>The Gaia Institute</u>, <u>The Bronx River Alliance</u>, Rocking the Boat, and others. This year there are <u>47 Mentors at 16 Institutions</u>. Some of the bright students are offered the opportunity to extend their research explorations during the school year in the <u>'AFTER-SCHOOL ALL-YEAR-ROUND RESEARCH PROGRAM</u>.'

<u>The DURATION of the program LASTS FOR EIGHT WEEEKS in SUMMER and</u> <u>an AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM</u>. <u>The students have been performing research with as many</u> <u>as 47 RENOWNED MENTORS IN OVER 17 INSTITUTIONS all over the Tri-State Area</u>.

Students are given a thorough background related to their individual research projects. They undergo a rigorous training on the techniques, safe & proper handling of devices, instruments, chemicals & biologicals. Students are given individual projects. Frequent lectures & tutorials are given by scientists & researchers. At the end of their projects the students are required to submit reports. Guidance and background is given to enable them to build self-confidence and presentation skills. The students are required to submarize their work and present their results in weekly HCS conferences held at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. All the students are encouraged to compete with other students at several regional and national science conferences and competitions.

We are proud to say that all of the past students Successfully Participated & Competed in several Regional & National Science conferences & Competitions, presenting their work with full self confidence and Excellent Presentation, winning in numerable Regional and National Awards including the 'New York Times Scholarship'. They were sent to present their work at National Symposia all over the country – around the Tri-state area, Chicago, San Diego, Colorado, etc. They developed a sense of responsibility & commitment towards completion of their work and projects. Some of our past students have since joined leading universities like Penn State, Rutgers, Swarthmore, Cornell, and 'Seven year- combined Medical School program at UMDNJ'. All of the students have expressed an intense interest in the pursuit of Research and Education in Sciences & Medicine.
